## **1. INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 Prospectus Overview**

This prospectus outlines the admission process for Four Year Under Graduate Programmes in the Teaching Departments of the University of Kerala for the Academic year 2025-26. It provides essential information and Regulations governing FYUG Admissions. The prospectus issued by the University during the previous years for FYUG Admissions in the Teaching Departments is not valid for the Academic Year 2025-26.

### **1.2 About the University**

The University of Kerala, one of India's first 16 Universities, was established in 1937 as the University of Travancore in the erstwhile princely state of Travancore (now the southern part of Kerala). In 1957, following the formation of the unified state of Kerala, the University of Travancore was renamed the University of Kerala. The institution is presently governed by the Kerala University Act of 1974.

#### **Governance and Administration**

The Vice-Chancellor, appointed by the Governor of Kerala, is the chief executive officer of the University. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor assists the Vice-Chancellor. The key decision-making bodies include:

- **The Senate** – The supreme authority on general policy matters, comprising 117 members representing diverse sectors.
- **The Academic Council** – The principal academic body responsible for formulating Regulations, Academic Policies, and Curriculum Structures.

- **The Syndicate** – The chief executive body with 25 members, overseeing the University's administration and operations.

## Academic and Research Structure

The University of Kerala encompasses a robust academic framework with:

- 43 Departments of Teaching and Research, organized under 11 Schools, predominantly located at the Karyavattom campus.
- A network of affiliated colleges across Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, and Alappuzha Districts.
- A student body exceeding 2000 full-time students (including research scholars) with a significant presence of international students in the University Departments.
- 196 affiliated colleges with an enrollment of over 1,30,000 students.
- University Institutes of Technology (UITs) and University Colleges of Teacher Education (UTECS) offering UG and selected PG Programmes.
- Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), catering to approximately 30,000 students nationwide.
- The University College of Engineering at Karyavattom offers Engineering education at Undergraduate level.

## Academic Framework

The University follows a three-tier academic system:

1. **Boards of Studies** – Governs subject-wise syllabus design and academic actions.
2. **Faculties (16 in total)** – Groups of related disciplines.
3. **Academic Council** – The apex academic body governing curriculum and Academic Regulations.

The University follows the Choice Based Credit and Semester System for all Under-Graduate (bachelors) level and Post- Graduate (masters) Programmes.

## Recognition and Accolades

### 1.3 About the Programme:

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP) is launched in recognition of the requirement to strengthen undergraduate education. The curricula of the programme are designed to equip students with the knowledge base, intellectual abilities, multidisciplinary perspectives, flexible skill sets, basic expertise, social commitment and research aptitude that will make them responsible citizens in a knowledge society and offer them multiple opportunities in research and employment.

From the academic year 2024 – 25 onwards, the teaching departments of the University, in association with the Centre for Under Graduate Studies, University of Kerala located at Kariavattom Campus are offering sixteen major disciplines and fifty-one minor disciplines for the FYUGP. The programmes will have two Broad Pathways, (a) 3 year UG Degree and (b) 4 year UG Degree (Honours) with Research. The course will have four major components- (1) Foundation Courses grouped into 4 major baskets as Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Addition Courses (VAC) and Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC), (2) Discipline Specific Major (3) Discipline Specific Minor/Multidisciplinary and (4) Research Component with dissertation, internship and field surveys. *Students who choose to exit after 3 years shall be awarded UG Degree in their respective Major Discipline after the successful completion of the required minimum number of Courses and Credits.* The candidates with a CGPA of 7.5 or above in the previous six semesters of the Programme are eligible to join the Honours Programme with Research. UG Honours Degree with research in the Major Discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the Programme with specific number of Courses/Credits in their major discipline.

The Curriculum shall be in accordance with the Curriculum Framework and Academic Regulations of the University of Kerala. The candidates for the Programme commencing in the academic year 2025-26, shall be admitted based on Entrance Examination.

#### **1.4 IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

- All candidates who wish to apply for FYUG Programmes (irrespective of Category) should register online.
- After completion of the online registration, the candidate should take printout of the same and keep it with herself/himself. Do not send hard copies of the print out to the University. The hard copy of the online application with supporting documents should be kept by the candidate and it has to be submitted at the time of admission to respective departments.
- The candidates who come under the PWD (Persons with Disability) category should specifically mention the same at the time of Online Registration.
- Candidates coming under SC/ST/OEC/SEBC are not eligible for EWS reservation. Only the general category candidates belonging to the Forward communities, who are economically backward, are eligible for EWS reservation. A certificate from the Revenue authorities to that effect has to be produced at the time of admission.

- No memo will be sent by post in the case of defective applications. But edit option will be provided for a stipulated period and no corrections or changes will be allowed after the stipulated period.
- Inclusion of a candidate in the Rank lists or allotment does not entitle him/her for admission to a Programme, unless the rules regarding eligibility for admission, as laid down in the Prospectus under various Clauses, are satisfied.
- The Entrance Examination Centres in Kerala are: Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Alappuzha Pathanamthitta, Kottayam, Idukki (Munnar), Ernakulam, Thrissur, Palakkad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, Wayanad, Kannur and Kasaragod.
- Two optional centres outside Kerala—Chennai and Delhi—will be available subject to sufficient applicants.
- The Vice- Chairman, CSS, has the authority to cancel any centers with fewer than 100 applicants.

## 2. DEPARTMENTS, PROGRAMMES AND SEATS

### 2.1 Details of Programmes and Duration

The Programmes leads to Honours Degree (Four Years) in the relevant subject. The Programme of study shall be by regular attendance for the requisite number of Lecture Courses, Tutorial Courses, Laboratory Work and other means.

The list of University Departments and the Programmes to which admissions are to be made, and the total *approved number of seats in each Department* are given as **Annexure – I** of the Prospectus.

### 2.2 Categorization of Seats

Seats available in University Departments are mainly classified as Merit Seats and Reservation seats.

- Merit Seats:** The seats that are to be filled by the University purely on merit basis irrespective of any reservation for the Departments are classified as “Merit Seats”.
- Reservation Seats:** The seats in the Departments of the University that are earmarked for SC/ST/SEBC are classified as “Reservation Seats.”
- EWS:** The seats in the Departments of the University that are earmarked for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) belonging to Forward Communities.



### 3. RESERVATION OF SEAT

#### 3.1 Types of Reservations

Seats will be reserved for the following categories in the University Departments for various FYUG Programmes.

- a. Mandatory Reservation
- b. Special Reservation

##### 3.1.1 Mandatory Reservation:

The seats for each Programme in the University Departments will be distributed as per the U.O (MS) No.107/08/H.Edn. dated 30.8.08 and corresponding U.O Ac.B/I/Admns BC/2008 dated 20.9.2008. To ensure the eligible percentage of reservation for all communities, the rotation of category is done with seat matrix every year. After allotting seats as per seat matrix, the remaining fraction (positive/negative) of each year will be carried over to the next year.

Reservation of communities and the percentage shall be governed by the government orders issued till date.

*Lists of eligible communities for reservation are given in Annexures IV, V, VI, VII*

\*Candidates who enjoy communal reservation such as SEBC, SC/ST are not eligible for EWS reservations. Only candidates belonging to Forward Communities, who are Economically Backward, are eligible for EWS reservations. Such candidates must produce EWS certificate from the Village Officer/Revenue Authority concerned.

##### 3.1.2 Special Reservation

Supernumerary seats shall be available for each FYUG Programme under the following categories. Claims for Special Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of online application.

**1. Non-Keralite Candidates:**

- One seat shall be allotted to a candidate from the rank list who is not a native of Kerala.

**2. Foreign Candidates:**

- There shall be supernumerary seats for eligible foreign candidates, subject to the relevant Regulations governing foreign students' admissions.

**3. Transgender Students:**

- Additional seats shall be created exclusively for transgender students in accordance with government norms (G.O. (Ms) No. 153/2018 HEdn dated 03.07.2018).
- Candidates seeking admission under this category must submit a Transgender Identity Card issued by the State Government along with the relevant documents at the time of submitting the hard copy of the online application form.

**4. Sponsored Candidates:**

- One seat shall be allotted to a sponsored candidate from Government Departments, Research & Development (R&D) Institutions, or Industries, provided the candidate has a minimum of two years of work experience.

**5. Differently Abled Persons (PWD)**

- One seat shall be reserved for candidates with a disability of 40% or above when the sanctioned intake for the Programme is below 25.
- For subjects in Science and Technology streams, eligibility shall be determined by the CSS Academic Committee (CSSAC) based on the recommendations of the respective Department Council and CSS Admission Committee.
- As per Clause 2 (t), Chapter I of the Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995, a "Person with Disability" refers to an individual suffering from a disability of not less than 40%, as certified by a Medical Authority constituted for this purpose. Candidates with a minimum of 40% disability are eligible to apply under this quota.
- Candidates seeking admission under the PWD category must submit a Certificate of Disability issued by the District Medical Board or a higher competent authority.
- The certificate must specify the degree and percentage of disability and should be issued not earlier than 12 months prior to the admission date.
- Candidates under the Differently Abled Persons (PWD) category must specify their status during online registration.
- Selection under this category shall be strictly based on the rank in the Entrance Examination, and not on the degree of disability.
- No seat reservation is available for blind candidates in Science subjects.
- Blind candidates who require the assistance of a scribe for the Entrance Examination

must obtain prior permission from the Controller of Examinations, University of Kerala.

## **6. Sports Quota**

- One seat shall be given for sports persons over and above the sanctioned strength in each Under Graduate Degree Programme. Admission to such seats shall be made as per the procedure for admission under sports quota. If the required number of sports persons is not available, the seats should be kept vacant and shall not be filled by other candidates.

### **Norms for Admission to the Seats Reserved under Sports Quota for UG Courses.**

The criteria for verification and ranking of sports achievement certificates are based on the specified priority (*see Annexure II*).

#### **General Guidelines for Admission under Sports Quota**

- i. Candidates who seek admission under sports quota should apply online within the prescribed time.
- ii. The achievement certificate received before the closure of registration of UG Programmes will only be considered for ranking in sports quota admissions.
- iii. For securing admission to FYUG Programmes under Sports Quota, the performance of the candidate during the preceding two years/ Higher Secondary Level shall only be considered.
- iv. For filling up the seats reserved under Sports quota, hierarchy of preference shall be given as per the norms/ guidelines formulated by the University in addition to satisfying his/her academic eligibility.
- v. When the candidates fulfill minimum academic eligibility, the academic merit shall not be preferred over sports merit in sports quota reservation seats except in the case of a tie in the sports merit.
- vi. The candidates who wish to apply under sports quota should opt “Sports – Yes” during online registration. They need to select the level of achievement in the online application.
- vii. University will then conduct centralized verification of the application and authenticity of Sports Certificates. Provisional Rank list will be published after the verification.
- viii. The admission will be determined by the Head of the Department (HoD) based on this Rank list and subject to the verification of original certificates. The date of admission will be communicated to candidates via a Memo.
- ix. If any discrepancy is detected during the verification of original certificates, the candidate will not be eligible for admission under the sports quota.
- x. The Original Certificate/s from the competent authority/authorities (Secretary, Organizer, etc., as per the Circular Letter No. Ad.D1.3.1276/74 dated 23.01.1979) must be produced by the candidate to prove his/her claim.

## **Tie-Breaking Criteria for Sports Merit**

In event of a tie in sports merit, the following criteria will be considered to resolve the tie, in order of priority outlined below.

1. A weightage of marks may be given to the candidates who have achievements in the following games selected by the University for the purpose of tie breaking only (Major games).
  - Football
  - Cricket
  - Basketball
  - Volleyball
  - Badminton
  - Kabaddi
  - Athletics
  - Aquatics
2. Year of achievement (Preference shall be given to achievements in year closer to the year of application)
3. Academic merit.

The List of sports disciplines considered for UG admissions is mentioned in Annexure III.

### **3.1.3 Reservation for Nominees:**

#### **(i) Reservation for Candidates from Union Territory of Lakshadweep.**

Additional seat shall be created for FYUG Programmes, exclusively for the students sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. (Govt. letter No.5455/B3/2006/H.Edn. dated 15-3-2006) (U.O.No.Ac.B/1/1134/2006 dated 26-4-2006).

#### **(ii) Concession for Wards of Kashmiri Migrants.**

The following relevant concessions are applicable for wards of Kashmiri Migrants for admission to the FYUG Programmes (U.O.No.Ac.B1/910/Admns/2012, dated 09/04/2012).

- \* Extension in date of admission by about 30 days.
- \* Relaxation in cut off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- \* Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course wise.
- \* Waiving of domicile requirements.
- \* Facilitation of migration in second and subsequent years.

#### **(iii) Reservation for candidates from Jammu and Kashmir.**

Additional seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength to

accommodate candidates belonging to Jammu & Kashmir for admission to FYUG Programmes (UO No. Ac B1/2292/Adms/2012 dated 01.03.2013).

**(iv) Reservation for Inmates of Government Children's Home.**

Additional seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength for Inmates of Government Children's Home and Establishments which functions as per Juvenile Justice Act. In the event of non-applicants from the above establishments, the applications of candidates from approved Children's Homes duly recommended by the District Social Welfare Officer shall be considered. (U.O.No. Ac B1/055682/2012 dated 30.04.2013).

**(v) Reservation of seats for the widows/wards of Defence Personnel, killed/disabled in action or during peace time.**

Additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength may be created as and when required for the widows/wards of Defence Personnel, killed or disabled in action or during peace time, in Central/State Universities /Autonomous/ Professional / Non-Professional Institutions under the purview of Ministry of Human Resource Development as per UGC policy (Applicable to Army/Navy/Airforce only. Not applicable to paramilitary forces/CAPF/GREF/Coast Guard etc.).

- **Important: The seats reserved under Differently Abled, Transgender, Sports Quota and other categories mentioned in 3.1.3 are created over and above the sanctioned strength. In the absence of the candidates who are eligible for these reservations, such seats will remain unfilled.**
- **Candidates claiming reservation under Clause 3.1.2 and 3.1.3 should be included in the Rank List and submit a separate application in hard copy, along with a printout of the online application form and relevant documents, to the Deputy Registrar, Credit and Semester System, University of Kerala, Kariavattom, Pin - 695581, on or before the commencement of the Entrance Examination. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in disqualification from consideration under these categories.**
- **Claims for Reservations under 3.1.3 must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of online application**

#### **4 CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED**

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of online application. Candidates should also mention the item of reservation claimed in the relevant columns in the online application. Candidates should also satisfy the eligibility conditions as per Clause 5 of the Prospectus. The claims for mandatory reservation once made in the application cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.

##### **4.1 Open Merit Seats**

The seats under the Open Merit category will be filled purely on a merit basis irrespective of the Category/Community to which the candidates belong.

## **4.2 Community Reservation**

### **4.2.1 Claim for Communal Reservation under ‘Socially and Educationally Backward Classes’ (SEBC)**

Reservation of seats for the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. Dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time. Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other Backward Hindus, Latin Catholic/SIUC, and Other Backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under the SEBC Quota, should invariably obtain a Non-Creamy Layer Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar and should submit it at the time of admission. (U.O.No.Ad.A.5.3.57643 (a)/2017 dated 06.10.2017). Only the claims of candidates belonging to those communities that are included in the official list of communities will be considered. (U.O.No.Ac.BI/UG Adms. BC/2011, dated 11.01.2012).

### **4.2.2 Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Quota**

- a. Candidates seeking reservation under the SC/ST category must obtain a valid Caste/Community Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar. Submission of any fraudulent certificate to claim SC/ST reservation will result in stringent legal actions as per prevailing Regulations.
- b. If sufficient candidates are not available to fill the seats reserved for SC/ST candidates, the same will be notified in the media three times (on three different dates), and separate allotments for vacant SC/ST seats will be made by the University. If seats remain unfilled, SC seats will be converted to ST seats and vice versa. However, if SC/ST seats are still vacant even after this, such seats will be filled by candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities (OEC) included in Annexure VI of the Prospectus and, in their absence, by candidates from the SEBC category included in Annexure VII from the existing rank list. If vacancies persist, the seats will be allotted under the Open Merit quota.
- c. Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates: Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the un-availed seats, if any, under the SC/ST quota should furnish Community and Income certificates obtained from the Village Officer/Tahsildar concerned. Those OEC candidates whose annual family income is up to Rs. 6 lakhs (Rupees Six lakhs only) alone are eligible for such seats. OEC seats will be filled as per rules laid by the Government
- d. Scheduled caste converts do not come under the SC/ST category. They will be considered only under the OEC category.
- e. All the above provisions are general in nature, and reservations will be subject to the rules of the University in force at the time of admission. Communal and other reservations will be granted only upon satisfactory verification of the required original certificates at the time of admission. These reservations will be governed by the prevailing University Regulations, subject to amendments from time to time.

#### **4.2.3 Claim for Fee Concession to OEC Candidates**

Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities are exempted from payment of fees at the time of admission irrespective of annual family income as per G.O (MS) No. 36/07/SCSTDD, dated: 03.07.2007. They should provide the Community Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar at the time of admission.

### **5 NATIVITY**

Candidate should be an Indian citizen. For foreign candidates, relevant Regulations apply.

## **6 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

### **6.1 Academic Eligibility**

A pass in Higher Secondary Examination of the State/ICSE/CBSE or an equivalent examination accepted by the University shall be considered as equivalent academic eligibility for admission to the Programme.

- (i) The candidate who opts for Biology, Physics, Computer Science, Chemistry, and Mathematics should have studied the opted subjects at the Plus Two or Equivalent level examinations.
- (ii) Candidates who have written the Higher Secondary Examination or equivalent and awaiting results can also apply. The candidate should pass the qualifying examination at the time of admission.
- (iii) Any candidate admitted to a FYUG Programme of this University in any subject in earlier years shall be eligible to apply for admission to any FYUG Programme.
- (iv) **Multiple applications:** A candidate may apply for a maximum of five FYUG Programmes through a single registration. Submission of multiple applications will not be entertained and will lead to rejection.

### **6.2 Indulgence in Ragging as disqualification:**

If an applicant for admission is found to have engaged in ragging in the past or if it is discovered later that they had participated in such behavior, admissions shall be denied or the student shall be expelled from the University. At the time of admission, the student must provide an undertaking in accordance with the provisions by the anti- ragging verdict by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (Annexure VIII).

## **7 AGE LIMIT**

The maximum age limit for admission to the FYUG Programme shall be as follows as on 1<sup>st</sup> June of the academic year:

For General / SEBC candidates - 23 years

For SC/ST candidates - 25 years

## 8 RANK LIST

Rank list for admission shall be prepared based on the performance in the Entrance Examination. Those who secure 'zero mark' or 'negative mark' shall not be included in the Rank List.

## 9 RESOLVING OF TIE

In the case of more than one candidate obtaining equal marks in the Entrance Examinations, the following will be considered.

- Marks of the subject opted.
- Date of Birth (older be placed higher in ranking).

## 10 HOW TO APPLY

### 10.1 General Instructions

- (a) Any candidate who wishes to join a FYUG Programme in the University Departments should compulsorily register online at <http://admissions.keralauniversity.ac.in>. A candidate will have the facility to apply for a maximum of 5 Programmes through a single registration. Submission of Multiple applications will not be entertained. Upon successful completion of the online registration, the candidate should take a printout of the same.
- (b) Read the instructions carefully before proceeding with the registration.
- (c) Do not press the "Back" button during the registration process.

### 10.2 Online Registration Fee

The registration fee must be remitted via online payment only. Candidates shall not remit the fee in any other form, such as Demand Draft or Cheque. The registration fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

### 10.3 Submission of Application

The online application process consists of the following mandatory steps:

1. Register on the website by providing Basic information.
2. Login to the candidate's page using the application number and password (date of birth will be the default password).
3. Enter Personal Details and details of opted Programmes for Entrance Examinations.
4. Pay the Registration Fee online.
5. Upload Photo and Signature in the prescribed format.
6. Download the Application Form from the candidate's profile.
7. Download the Hall Ticket before the date of the Entrance Examination.



## 11 ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

### 11.1 Entrance Examination as a Mandatory Requirement

There shall be an Entrance Examination for admission to each FYUG Programme. No candidate shall be admitted to a FYUG Programme without taking the Entrance Examination, except for SC/ST candidates admitted to vacant seats, foreign candidates, and sponsored candidates.

### 11.2 Nature of Entrance Examination

The examination will be conducted as indicated below:

- **No. of Questions:** 40
- **Maximum Marks:** 160 (4 marks for each correct answer).
- **Duration:** 1 hour (1 additional hour for candidates who opted for each additional subjects).
- **Marking Scheme:** 4 marks for each correct answers, 1 mark will be deducted for each incorrect answers.
- **Medium of Instruction:** English (except for language papers).
- **Syllabus:** Questions based on Major subjects (Higher Secondary/Plus 2 Level).
- The candidates can opt One Programme from each group upto a maximum of 5 Programmes.

The Group of Programmes are detailed below:

III	History, Mathematics, Psychology
IV	Malayalam, Biology, Commerce, Computer Science, Geology

### 11.3 Conduct of Entrance Examinations

- The Office of the CSS shall conduct the Entrance Examinations.
- No re-examination shall be provided to absentees under any circumstances.

### 11.4 Online Admit Cards

- (a) The Admit Card for the Entrance Examination can be downloaded from the candidate's profile (<http://admissions.keralauniversity.ac.in>).

- (b) Admit cards will not be sent by post from the University.
- (c) The examination venue and timetable will be provided in the admit card.

### **11.5 Revaluation**

There shall be no revaluation of Entrance Examination answer scripts.

## **12 WEIGHTAGE**

In assessing merit, marks will be awarded for extracurricular activities like NCC, NSS Student Police Cadet (SPC) and Scout & Guides of the students and also to Ex-servicemen / widows or children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen.

A weightage of marks normalized to 1.7 will be awarded to Ex-servicemen/widows or children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen and to the candidates under the categories, NCC, NSS, SPC, Scout and Guide based on the maximum of the Entrance Examination i.e.; 15/1400\*160 is applicable for the 2025 Admission.

### **12.1 Weightage of marks for NCC / NSS / SPC/ Scout & Guides certificate holders**

The candidates who have attended NSS / NCC / SPC/ Scout & Guides during the academic year of the qualifying examinations i.e., plus two only will be eligible for the bonus mark.

#### **Note:**

- a) In respect of candidates who want to avail bonus marks for NCC, the marks will be awarded on the basis of NCC Weightage Certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to the candidates who have secured at least 75% of attendance after having participated in its activities during the course of study immediately preceding the course for which admission is sought.
- b) For awarding bonus marks to NSS participants, the basis will be NSS certificates signed by the Competent Authority.
- c) For awarding bonus mark to SPC, the basis will be the certificates signed by the Competent Authority.
- d) For awarding bonus mark to Scout and Guides, the certificate signed by the Competent Authority shall be submitted. (Only Rajyapuraskar & Nanmamudra Certificates are accepted).
- e) The benefit of bonus marks for purposes of admission can be earned by the candidates only under any one category (either NSS or NCC or SPC or Scout and Guides).

### **12.2 Weightage of marks for Ex-servicemen/ widows or children of Jawans and Ex-Servicemen.**

To avail the weightage of bonus mark under the category “Ex-servicemen / widows or

children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen”, the candidates should invariably produce an attested copy of certificate issued not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application, from the military authorities or State/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter/widow of a Jawan / Ex-service man or an Ex-service man himself/herself. Applicable to Army/Navy/Air force only. Not applicable to paramilitary forces/CRPF/GREF/Coast Guard etc. (U.O. No. Ac.B.3/Misc./73 dated 30-10-1974). (Academic Council dated 28-08-1974).

## 13 ADMISSION ACTIVITIES

### 13.1 Reporting

Candidates must report for admission before the Head of the Department concerned only when the University announces the admission schedule. Candidates should report with the following original documents:

- a) Print out of completed online application.
- b) Admission Memo
- c) Original mark list/certificate of the qualifying examination.
- d) Certificate to prove date of birth.
- e) TC from the Institution last attended.
- f) Course & Conduct Certificate.
- g) Migration Certificate from the Board/University last studied.
- h) Candidates applying for the EWS seat must provide a certificate from the relevant Village Officer/Revenue Authority.
- i) Caste/Community Certificate for candidates under Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes quota.
- j) Non Creamy Layer Certificate in the case of SEBC candidates.
- k) Non Creamy Layer Certificate in the case of OEC candidates claiming vacant SC/ST seats.
- l) Non Creamy Layer Certificate/Community Certificate in the case of OEC candidates claiming fee concession.
- m) Original certificates to prove the claim for grace marks/weightage if any.
- n) Eligibility Certificate from the University of Kerala in case of candidates who have passed qualifying examination other than HSE/ VHSE conducted by Government of Kerala or the examination conducted by CBSE (AISSCE) and ISC.
- o) Transgender identity card issued by the State Government if applicable.
- p) Undertaking from the students as per the provisions of anti-ragging verdict by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. (Annexure VIII)
- q) Any other required documents specified by the University.

**Candidates failing to report on time will forfeit their admission claim.**

***APAAR ID is mandatory for completing the procedure of admission***

### 13.2 Verification of Documents

The Head of the Department shall be responsible for verification of original documents and satisfaction of the correctness of the records produced by the candidate at the time of

admission. The Head of the Department will have the right to deny an admission, if he/she finds any relevant mismatch in the original documents and online data that has affected the ranking process.

### 13.3 Failure to Report for Admission

Candidates who fail to report for admission on the prescribed date and time will forfeit their claim to Admission. The University of Kerala will not entertain any requests for changes to the admission schedule once the dates are announced.

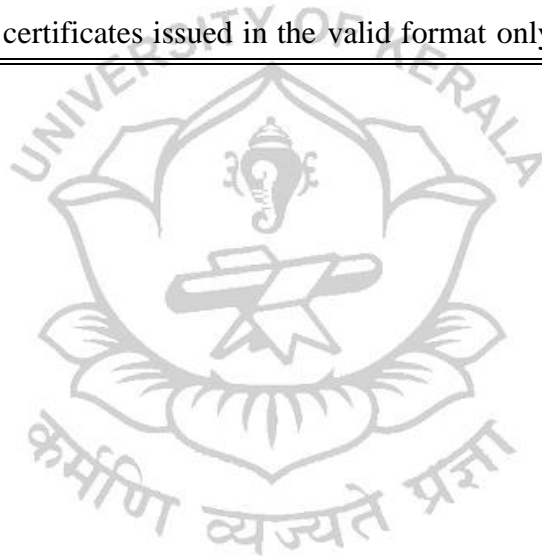
