1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Prospectus Overview

This Prospectus provides details regarding admission to AICTE-approved M.Tech. Degree Programmes in the Teaching Departments of the University of Kerala for the Academic Year 2026-27. It includes general information and Regulations governing the M.Tech. Admission process. The Prospectus issued by the University during the previous years for M.Tech. Admissions in the Teaching Departments is not valid for the Academic Year 2026-2027.

1.2 About the University

The University of Kerala, one of India's first 16 Universities, was established in 1937 as the University of Travancore in the erstwhile princely state of Travancore (now the southern part of Kerala). In 1957, following the formation of the unified state of Kerala, the University of Travancore was renamed the University of Kerala. The institution is presently governed by the Kerala University Act of 1974.

Governance and Administration

The Vice-Chancellor, appointed by the Governor of Kerala, is the chief executive officer of the University. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor assists the Vice-Chancellor. The key decision-making bodies include:

- **The Senate** – The supreme authority on general policy matters, comprising 117 members representing diverse sectors.
- **The Academic Council** – The principal academic body responsible for formulating Regulations, Academic Policies, and Curriculum Structures.
- **The Syndicate** – The chief executive body with 25 members, overseeing the University's administration and operations.

Academic and Research Structure

The University of Kerala encompasses a robust academic framework with:

- 43 Departments of Teaching and Research, organized under 11 Schools, predominantly located at the Karyavattom campus.
- A network of affiliated colleges across Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, and Alappuzha Districts.
- A student body exceeding 2000 full-time students (including research scholars) with a significant presence of international students in the University Departments.
- Centre for Undergraduate Studies (CUS) at the Karyavattom Campus, offering 16 Major and 51 Minor Four Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP).
- 196 affiliated colleges with an enrollment of over 130,000 students.
- University Institutes of Technology (UITs) and University Colleges of Teacher Education (UTECS) offering UG and selected PG Programmes.
- Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), catering to approximately 30,000 students nationwide.

1.4 Admission Process

The following three departments offer AICTE-approved M.Tech Programmes under the Faculty of Engineering & Technology. Student with a valid GATE score may be provided with scholarship by AICTE.

- **M.Tech. Computer Science with Specialization in Digital Image Computing** – Department of Computer Science.
- **M.Tech. Technology Management** – Department of Futures Studies.
- **M.Tech. Electronics & Communication (Optoelectronics & Optical Communications)** – Department of Optoelectronics.

Admissions are based on GATE scores or the Entrance Examination marks for non-GATE candidates.

1.5 Important Information

- All candidates applying for M.Tech. Programmes, regardless of category, must register online.
- After completing the online registration, candidates must retain a printout of the application. Hard copies should not be sent to the University. However, the hard copy along with supporting documents should be kept by the candidate and submitted at the time of admission to the respective Department.
- Candidates belonging to SC/ST/OEC/SEBC are not eligible for EWS reservations. Only candidates belonging to Forward Communities, who are Economically Backward, are eligible for EWS reservations. Such candidates must produce EWS Certificate from the Village Officer/Revenue Authority concerned.
- No memos will be sent by post for defective applications. However, an edit option will be available for a stipulated period. No corrections will be permitted after this period.
- Appearing for the Entrance Examination, inclusion in the Rank List or seat allotment does not guarantee admission unless all eligibility criteria outlined in the Prospectus are met.
- The Entrance Examination shall be conducted at the following Centres: Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Alappuzha, Ernakulam, Kottayam, Thrissur, Kozhikode, and Kannur.
- A candidate may opt for a maximum of three Centres of Examination as preferred choices.
- The conduct of the Entrance Examination at any Centre shall be subject to the availability of a sufficient number of applicants. The Vice-Chairman, CSS, reserves the right to cancel any Centre in the event that the number of applicants is fewer than 100.

2. DEPARTMENTS, PROGRAMMES AND SEATS

2.1 Programme Details

The Programme leads to M.Tech. Degree in the relevant subject under the Faculty of Engineering & Technology. These Programmes are approved by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE). The Programme extends for a period of four semesters. The Programme of study shall be by regular attendance for the requisite number of lectures, practical training and other means.

2.2 Institutions and Seat Allocation

The list of Departments, Programmes, and total approved seats is given in **Annexure I**.

2.3 Categorization of Seats

Seats available in University Departments are mainly classified as Open Merit Seats, Community Merit Seats and seats reserved for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) category.

- **Open Merit Seats:** The seats that are to be filled by the University purely on **merit basis**, irrespective of any reservation for the Departments.
- **Community Merit Seats:** The seats in the Departments of the University that are earmarked for **SC/ST/SEBC** category.
- **EWS:** The seats in the Departments of the University that are earmarked for **Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)** belonging to Forward Communities.

3. RESERVATION OF SEATS

3.1 Department-wise seat distribution

Department of Computer Science (Total: 18 seats)

- Sponsored: 5
- SC/ST: 3
- General: 10 (with mandatory reservation for SEBC/EWS/PWD)

Department of Future Studies (Total: 15 seats)

- Sponsored: 2
- SC/ST: 3
- General: 10 (with mandatory reservation for SEBC/EWS/PWD)

Department of Optoelectronics (Total: 18 seats)

- Sponsored: 5
- SC/ST: 3
- General: 10 (with mandatory reservation for SEBC/EWS/PWD)

3.2 Mandatory Reservation

Seats are distributed as per G.O (MS) No.107/08/H.Edn. dated 30.08.2008 and corresponding U. O. AcB/I/Admns BC/2008 dated 20.09.2008. To ensure the representation of all communities, the rotation of category is done with seat matrix every year. After allotting seats as per seat matrix, the remaining fraction (positive/negative) of each year will be carried over to the next year.

Differently Abled Persons (PWD) – 3%

Reservation for communities and the percentage shall be governed by the government orders issued to date and are applicable only to Keralites.

Lists of eligible communities for reservation are given in Annexures II, III, IV and V

- Candidates who enjoy communal reservation such as SEBC, SC/ST and OEC are not eligible for EWS reservations. Only candidates belonging to Forward Communities, who are Economically Backward, are eligible for EWS reservations. Such candidates must produce EWS Certificate from the Village Officer/Revenue Authority concerned.

- **Differently Abled Persons (PWD):** As per Clause 2 (t), Chapter I of the Persons with Disabilities Act 1995, “Person with disability” means a person suffering from not less than 40% of any disability as certified by a Medical Authority constituted for this purpose. Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible to apply for this quota. Candidates seeking admission under PWD category should attach “Certificate of disability, issued not earlier than 12 months prior to the admission, by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability.

4. CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED

Claims for mandatory reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of the online application. Candidates should also mention the item of reservation claimed in the relevant fields in the online application. Candidates should also satisfy the eligibility conditions as per Clause 5 of the Prospectus. The claims for mandatory reservation once made in the application cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.

4.1 Open Merit Seats

The seats under the Open Merit category will be filled purely on merit basis irrespective of the Category/Community to which the candidates belong.

4.2 Community Reservation

4.2.1 Claim for communal reservation under ‘Socially and Educationally Backward Classes’ (SEBC)

Reservation of seats for the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. Dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time.

Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other Backward Hindus, Latin Catholic, and Other Backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under the SEBC Quota, should invariably obtain a Non-Creamy Layer Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar and should submit it at the time of admission. (U.O.No.Ad.A.5.3.57643 (a)/2017 dated 06.10.2017). Only the claims of candidates belonging to those communities that are included in the official list of communities will be considered. (U.O.No.Ac.BI/UG Adms. BC/2011, dated 11.01.2012).

4.2.2 Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota

- a. Candidates seeking reservation under the SC/ST category must obtain a valid Caste/Community Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar. Submission of any fraudulent certificate to claim SC/ST reservation will result in stringent legal actions as per prevailing Regulations.
- b. If sufficient candidates are not available to fill the seats reserved for SC/ST candidates, the same will be notified in the media three times (on three different dates), and separate allotments for vacant SC/ST seats will be made by the University. If seats remain unfilled, SC seats will be converted to ST seats and vice versa. However, if SC/ST seats are still vacant even after this, such seats will be filled by candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities (OEC) included in Annexure IV of the Prospectus and, in their absence, by candidates from the SEBC category included in Annexure V from the existing rank list. If vacancies persist, the seats will be allotted under the Open Merit quota. All conversions shall be made in accordance with the seat matrix.
- c. Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates: Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the un-availed seats, if any, under the SC/ST quota should furnish Community and Income certificates obtained from the Village Officer/Tahsildar concerned. Those OEC candidates whose annual family income is up to Rs. 6 lakhs (Rupees Six lakhs only) alone are eligible for such seats. OEC seats will be filled as per rules laid by the Government.
- d. Scheduled caste converts do not come under the SC/ST category. They will be considered only under the OEC category.
- e. All the above provisions are general in nature, and reservations will be subject to the rules of the University in force at the time of admission. Communal and other reservations will be granted only upon satisfactory verification of the required original certificates at the time of admission. These reservations will be governed by the prevailing University Regulations, subject to amendments from time to time.

4.2.3 Claim for Fee Concession to OEC Candidates

Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities are exempted from payment of fees at the time of admission irrespective of annual family income as per G.O (MS) No. 36/07/SCSTDD, dated: 03.07.2007. They should provide the Community Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar at the time of Admission.

5. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

5.1 Nativity

Candidates must be Indian citizens. For foreign candidates, relevant Regulations apply.

5.2 Indulgence in Ragging as Disqualification

Applicants found guilty of ragging in the past or during their academic tenure will be denied admission or expelled. An undertaking as per the anti-ragging verdict by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (**Annexure VI**) must be submitted at the time of admission.

5.2.1 Indulgence in Drug Abuse as Disqualification

Applicants found guilty of involvement in the use, possession, or distribution of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances during their academic tenure will be denied admission or expelled from the programme. An undertaking to the effect that the applicant shall not indulge in drug abuse or related activities shall be submitted at the time of admission (**Annexure VII**).

5.3 Academic Eligibility

(i) For M.Tech. Programmes

Candidates should have pursued a Bachelor's Degree under the 10+2+4 scheme or a Master's degree under the 10+2+3+2/10+2+3+3 schemes from the University of Kerala or a degree recognized as equivalent thereto, with the following minimum qualifications:

- **CGPA of 2.2 or above** in a 4-point scale
- **3.8 or above** in a 7-point scale
- **5.5 or above** in a 10-point scale
- **55% or above** in case of Bachelor's Degrees awarding marks

(ii) Subject-Specific Eligibility

Candidates should hold a Bachelor's Degree in subjects specified in Section 6 for admission to corresponding M.Tech programmes. The CSS Academic Committee (CSSAC) shall be competent to recommend revisions to Section 6 from time to time.

(iii) Candidates awaiting Results

Candidates who have appeared for their Bachelor's Degree examination and are awaiting results may apply.

(iv) Candidates already admitted to PG Programmes

- i. Candidates admitted to a PG Programme of this University in any subject in earlier years shall be eligible to apply for M.Tech. Programmes subject to the prescribed eligibility criteria.

(v) Multiple Applications

A candidate may apply for a maximum of three M.Tech. Programmes through a single registration. Submission of Multiple Applications will not be entertained and will lead to rejection.

5.4 Equivalency/Eligibility Certificates

Candidates with degrees from institutions outside the University of Kerala must submit an Equivalency/Eligibility Certificate from the University, stating that their qualifying examination is recognized for admission to the relevant M.Tech. Degree programme.

5.5 Choice of Optional Subjects

The optional subject for the M.Tech. Programme be the same as the one which the student has selected as core course taken during graduation. In cases where the core course differs from the programme applied for, eligibility will be decided as per the existing rules of the University.

6. ELIGIBLE SPECIALIZATIONS

6.1 M.Tech. Computer Science with Specialization in Digital Image Computing

- A Bachelor's Degree in Engineering/Technology (B.Tech/B.E) with at least 55% marks in one of the following branches: Computer Science and Engineering/Information Technology/Electronics Engineering/Electrical Engineering/Electrical & Computer Engineering/Electronics and Computer Engineering/Computer Science and Engineering and Business Systems/Cyber Physical Systems/Computer Science & Design/Robotics and Artificial Intelligence/Internet of Things from the University of Kerala or equivalent recognized degree of a recognized University

OR

- First Class Master's Degree, M.Sc. in Computer Science/Artificial Intelligence/Data Science/Machine Learning/Master's in Computer Application (MCA) from the University of Kerala/M.Voc. Software Development or equivalent recognized degree of a recognized University. Preference will be given to candidates who have qualified GATE.
- **Eligibility for admissions to sponsored seats** will be governed by the following AICTE guidelines. The candidates should have:
 - (i) A Bachelor's Degree in Engineering/Technology (B.Tech/B.E) with at least 55% marks in one of the following branches: Computer Science and Engineering/Information Technology/Electronics Engineering/Electrical Engineering/Electrical & Computer Engineering/Electronics and Computer Engineering/Computer Science and Engineering and Business Systems/Cyber Physical Systems/Computer Science & Design/Robotics

and Artificial Intelligence/Internet of Things from the University of Kerala or equivalent recognized degree of a recognized University. Preference will be given to candidates who have qualified GATE.

(ii) A minimum two years of full time work experience in

- **Category I** – an Educational Institution/Research institution/any Government Department /Government Autonomous Organization.

OR

- **Category II** - a registered firm/Company/Industry in the relevant field with CMM level 5 /CMMI/ISO certification.
- Age limit: Less than 45 years as of 1st January of the admission year.

6.2 M.Tech. Technology Management

Eligibility:

- B.Tech. Degree or equivalent in any branch of Engineering/Technology with at least 55% marks from a recognized University in India.
- Preference will be given to GATE-qualified candidates.

Eligibility for Sponsored Seats:

- Bachelor's Degree in Engineering/Technology with at least 55% marks from an AICTE-approved institution. Preference will be given to GATE-qualified candidates.
- Minimum two years of full-time work experience in a registered firm/company/industry, an educational/research institution, or any Government Department/Autonomous Organization in the relevant field.
- Age limit: Less than 45 years as of 1st January of the admission year.

6.3 M.Tech. Electronics and Communication (Optoelectronics and Optical Communication)

Eligibility:

- BE/B.Tech. or equivalent Degree with at least 55% marks in Electronics/Electrical and Electronics/Electronics and Communication Engineering/Applied Electronics and Instrumentation.

OR

- M.Sc. in Physics/Applied Physics/Electronic Science/Electronics from the University of Kerala or an equivalent recognized Degree.
- Preference will be given to GATE-qualified candidates.

7. RELAXATION IN GRADE POINTS/MARKS

7.1 SC/ST Category

- **CGPA of 2.0 or above** in a 4-point scale
- **3.5 or above** in a 7-point scale
- **5.0 or above** in a 10-point scale
- **50% or above** in case of Bachelor Degrees awarding marks

7.2 SEBC Category

- **CGPA of 2.12 or above** in a 4-point scale
- **3.71 or above** in a 7-point scale
- **5.30 or above** in a 10-point scale
- **53% or above** in case of Bachelor Degrees awarding marks

7.3 Differently Abled Persons (PWD)

- **CGPA of 2.0 or above** in a 4-point scale
- **2.5 or above** in a 7-point scale
- **5.0 or above** in a 10-point scale
- **50% or above** in case of Bachelor Degrees awarding marks

8. RANK LIST

- **Non-Sponsored Seats:** Admission is based on valid GATE scores.
- If GATE-qualified candidates are unavailable, admission will be based on an Entrance Examination conducted by the University of Kerala.
- **Sponsored Candidates:** Ranking is based on 80% weightage for CGPA/aggregate marks at the bachelor level, 10% for work experience (1% per year), and 10% for an interview conducted by the Department Council.

9. RESOLVING OF TIE

In case of a tie in Entrance Examination scores, candidates with higher CGPA/marks in the qualifying examination (up to the VI semester for B.Tech/B.E.) will be ranked higher.

10. HOW TO APPLY

10.1 Online Registration

(a) Candidates seeking admission to the M.Tech. Degree Programme in the University Departments must register online either at <http://admissions.keralauniversity.ac.in> or <http://css.keralauniversity.ac.in>. A maximum of three programmes can be applied through a single registration. Upon successful registration, candidates must take a printout of the application.

(b) The website is optimized for the latest versions of Mozilla Firefox, Google Chrome, etc.

(c) Candidates must enable "JavaScript" before proceeding with registration.

(d) Carefully read the instructions before starting the registration process.

(e) Do not press the "Back" button while registering.

10.2 Online Registration Fee

The registration fee must be paid online. Payments through Demand Draft, Cheque, or any other method will not be accepted. The fee once remitted is non-refundable under any circumstances.

10.3 Submission of Application

The Online Application process consists of the following mandatory steps:

1. **Registering on the Site:** Click "Click New Registration to Register" on the admission portal and provide basic details. Log in using the generated application number and password. Change the password immediately.

2. **Entering Personal Details:** Enter details, including qualifying exam and reservation claims. All reservation claims must be supported with documents.
3. **Online Payment:** Proceed with online fee payment (as specified in clause 10.2).
4. **Uploading Photograph and Signature:** Upload scanned copies in the prescribed format.
5. **Verification of Application:** Review and edit details if necessary.
6. **Printout of Application:** Take a printout of the application for future reference. This must be presented at the time of admission. Hard copies should not be sent to the University.

Important Notes

- Admit Cards for the Entrance Examination can be downloaded from the website.
- Results of the Entrance Examination will be published on the website.

11. ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

11.1 Mandatory Entrance Examination for Non-GATE Candidates

Non-GATE candidates must take the Entrance Examination for admission. SC/ST candidates admitted to vacant seats, foreign candidates, sponsored candidates and Defence Personnel are exempted.

11.2 Examination Format

- 100 multiple-choice questions covering subject knowledge and logical/numerical reasoning.
- Duration: 2 hours.
- Medium: English.
- Rank lists will be prepared based on the percentile scores obtained in the Entrance Examination.
- The cut-off percentile, which is the minimum percentile required for a candidate to be included in the rank list, will be announced along with the publication of the rank lists.

11.3 Conduct of Entrance Examination

- No re-examinations will be conducted for absentees.
- Special arrangements will be made for Differently Abled candidates.
- Blind candidates who require the assistance of a scribe for the Entrance Examination must obtain prior permission from the Controller of Examinations, University of Kerala.
- Office CSS shall conduct the Entrance Examination.

11.4 Online Admit Cards

- Admit cards can be downloaded from admissions.keralauniversity.ac.in.
- Admit cards will not be sent by post.
- Candidates shall log in to the M.Tech Admission Portal using their credentials to download the Admit Card.
- The examination venue and schedule will be available on the admit card.

11.5 Marking System

- Each question carries one mark.
- Negative marking: 0.25 marks deducted per incorrect answer.
- No revaluation of answer scripts.

12. ADMISSION ACTIVITIES

12.1 Reporting at the University Department

Candidates must report for admission before the Head of the Department concerned only when the University announces the admission schedule. Candidates should report with the following original documents:

1. Print out of completed online application.
2. Admission Memo.
3. Certificate to prove date of birth.
4. Transfer Certificate (TC) and Conduct Certificate.
5. Marklists of the Degree examination and Provisional/Degree Certificate.
6. Eligibility Certificate (for candidates who have completed qualifying exams from other Universities).
7. Migration Certificate (for candidates from other universities).
8. Caste/Community Certificate for candidates under SC/ST category.
9. Non Creamy Layer Certificate in the case of SEBC candidates.
10. Non Creamy Layer Certificate and Community Certificate in the case of OEC candidate claiming vacant SC/ST seats.
11. GATE Scorecard (for GATE-qualified candidates)
12. Sponsored candidates shall produce the Experience Certificate and Sponsorship Certificate from the employer stating that the candidate is being sponsored to get admission to M.Tech programme in the University of Kerala. The employer should also indicate that the candidate will not be withdrawn mid way till the completion of the course. The date of issue of the Sponsorship Certificate shall be after the date of

admission notification. In addition to the above certificates, candidates belonging to Category II shall produce a certificate from the employer stating that the firm/company/industry is a registered one with a valid registration number and is a CMMI/CMM level 5/ISO certified one.

13. Undertaking from the students as per the provisions of Anti-Ragging verdict by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (**Annexure VI**).
14. Anti-Drug Declaration (**Annexure VII**).
15. Any other required documents specified by the University.

APAAR ID shall be mandatory for all candidates at the time of admission.

Candidates failing to report on time will forfeit their admission claim.

12.2 Verification of Documents

The Head of the Department shall be responsible for verification of original documents and satisfaction of the correctness of the records produced by the candidate at the time of admission. The Head of the Department will have the right to deny an admission, if he/she finds any relevant mismatch in the original documents and online data that has affected the ranking process.

12.3 Failure to Report

Candidates who fail to report for admission on the prescribed date and time will forfeit their claim to Admission. The University will not entertain any requests for changes to the admission schedule once the dates are announced.

13. FEE STRUCTURE

Candidates must remit the specified fees at the University Department at the time of admission. Details will be provided in the admission memo.

13.1 Fee Details

- **M.Tech. Computer Science with Specialization in Digital Image Computing:** Rs. 19,845/- (Sponsored: Rs. 15,750/- per year in addition to normal fee)
- **M.Tech. Technology Management (Futures Studies):** Rs. 8,160/- (Sponsored: Rs. 21,660/- in addition to normal fee)
- **M.Tech. Electronics and Communication (Optoelectronics and Optical Communication):** Rs. 26,662/- (Sponsored: Rs. 15,750/- per year in addition to normal fee)

- **SC/ST Candidates:** Exempted from payment.

13.2 Fee Exemptions for SC/ST Candidates

Candidates belonging to SC/ST communities allotted against merit seats or reserved seats are exempted from payment of fees at the time of admission.

13.3 Fee Concessions for OEC Candidates

Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities (OEC) are exempted from payment of fees at the time of admission to Post Graduate Programmes, irrespective of annual family income, as per G.O. (MS) No. 36/07/SCSTDD, dated: 03.07.2007. They must provide a Community Certificate from the Village Officer/Revenue Authority concerned.

13.4 Caution Deposit

All admitted candidates (including candidates from SC/ST/OEC categories) will be required to pay the Caution Deposit as per the existing rules.

13.5 Student Care Fund

All admitted candidates (including candidates from SC/ST/OEC categories) should remit a premium of Rs. 200/- for the Student Care Fund (a one-time payment for two years) at the time of admission.

14. OTHER ITEMS

14.1 Admission Process

The entire admission process for M.Tech. Degree Programmes for the academic year 2026-2027 will be conducted by the University of Kerala in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations for PG Programmes in the Teaching Departments of the University of Kerala (2020).

14.2 Jurisdiction of Disputes

All disputes related to the allotment and admission process shall fall under the jurisdiction of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala.

14.3 Final Decision Authority

Any matters not specifically covered in this Prospectus will be decided by the University of Kerala, and the decision of the University shall be final.
