The Sanskrit General curriculum, designed by the Board of Studies, University of Kerala, provides a rich, multifaceted education balancing traditional scholarship with modern methodologies. This programme integrates core Sanskrit General studies with interdisciplinary subjects, practical skills, and ethical values, preparing students for advanced studies and contemporary applications of Sanskrit. It honours ancient traditions while equipping students with tools to contribute innovatively and meaningfully to the field.

Historical Context

Historically, Sanskrit, as a link language, embodied a general form of education where specialised subjects were not distinctly separated. This inclusive approach is maintained in the modern curriculum, making the Sanskrit Knowledge System accessible to all. The curriculum emphasizes Sanskrit's practicality and relevance in contemporary times, aligning with the ethos of the New Education Policy 2020, which acknowledges Sanskrit as a significant classical language with immense contemporary value.

Contemporary Adaptation

The Sanskrit General curriculum is a product of Kerala's rich educational tradition, adapted to meet contemporary needs through a structured four-year programme. It seeks to provide holistic and accessible education, preparing students to navigate and contribute to various fields such as Ayurveda, Architecture, Computational Linguistics, and beyond. This programme is dedicated to public welfare and national development, ensuring the timeless wisdom of Sanskrit continues to thrive and evolve.

Objectives

The Sanskrit General discipline aims to:

- 1. Provide a thorough grounding in the Sanskrit language and its literature across different periods.
- 2. Highlight the interdisciplinary nature of Sanskrit studies by integrating linguistic, literary, philosophical, and cultural perspectives.
- 3. Foster critical thinking and analytical skills through the study of Sanskrit texts.
- 4. Encourage lifelong learning and research in Sanskrit, contributing to the preservation and advancement of this ancient knowledge system.
- 5. Promote an understanding of Sanskrit's influence on and relationship with other Indian languages, such as Prakrits and modern Indian languages.

Programme Structure

The FYUGP in Sanskrit General offers flexibility and depth, leading to a Bachelor's Degree or an Honours Degree with or without research, based on duration and credits. A 3-year programme awards a BA Degree with 133 to 150 credits. A 4-year programme awards either a BA Honours Degree or a BA Honours with Research Degree with 177 to 200 credits. There is also a Fast Track option with a duration of N-1 semester.

Curriculum Components

The Sanskrit General Discipline comprises several core components:

- DSC A: Covers various aspects of Sanskrit language, literature and culture from Vedic to contemporary periods.
- DSC B: Focuses on Sanskrit grammar and its formal applications.
- DSC C: Covers various genres and forms of Sanskrit literature, including the emerging Simple Standard Sanskrit.

DSE Courses: Offer specialized knowledge in various subfields of Sanskrit studies, allowing students to tailor their education to their specific interests and career goals. These include deeper insights into areas such as Linguistics, Ayurvedic schools, Indian Logic, and contemporary Sanskrit literature.

General Foundation Courses: Support and accelerate the study of DSCs and DSEs.

AEC (Ability Enhancement Courses): Enhance practical language skills and literary appreciation through courses on epic poetry, theatre, and more.

MDC (Multi-Disciplinary Courses): Integrate knowledge from and for other disciplines, offering a holistic education. These courses include the emerging Simple Standard Sanskrit, Vedic Mathematics, and Indian Knowledge Systems.

SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses): Develop practical skills related to Sanskrit and its applications, such as communicative Sanskrit, news reading, preaching skills, script reading, Manuscriptology, and film/documentary making.

VAC (Value Addition Courses): Instil ethical values and philosophical insights from Sanskrit, promoting a holistic worldview. Courses on yoga, well-being, and ethical teachings from Subhāṣitas are also available.

Overall, the Sanskrit General Discipline provides a comprehensive and flexible approach to learning Sanskrit.

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संस्कृतसामान्यम्—पाठ्यक्रमप्रवेशकम्

लोकेऽस्मिन् उपलब्धेषु बहुषु वाङ्मयेषु प्राचीनतमं तथा च साम्प्रतिकं वर्तते संस्कृतवाङ्मयम्। २०२०-राष्ट्रियशिक्षानीतेः ४.१७ इत्यनुच्छेदे भारतस्य शास्त्रीयभाषासु संस्कृतस्य पठनपाठनयोः महत्त्वं प्रासङ्गिकतां सौन्दर्यं च संवीक्ष्य लिखिति—'संस्कृतं संविधानस्य अष्टमानुसूच्यां वर्णिता महत्त्वपूर्णा आधुनिकभाषा विद्यते। अस्याः साहित्यम् एतादृशं विशालं विद्यते लैटिन्-ग्रीक्साहित्यं मेलियत्वा तुलना क्रियते चेदिप समानता न भवित। संस्कृतसाहित्ये गणितम्, दर्शनम्, व्याकरणम्, सङ्गीतम्, राजनीतिः, चिकित्सा, वास्तुकला, धातुविज्ञानम्, नाटकम्, कविता, कथाः (यस्य संस्कृतज्ञानप्रणाल्यां परिगणना भवित) इत्यादिविषयाणां विशालभाण्डागारो विद्यते। इति। अर्थाद् वाङ्मयमिदं सागरोपमं विशालमगाधञ्च। शिक्षानीतिदृष्टौ बृहद्विभवता बहुविषयकता चेति बिन्दुद्वये संस्कृतस्य प्राधान्यं घटते।

संस्कृतज्ञानप्रणाली संस्कृतसामान्यं च।

सूर्याधः कोऽपि विषयो नास्ति यदधिकृत्य संस्कृते किमपि न लिखितम्। अत्र ज्ञानविज्ञानयोः प्रायः सर्वाः विषयाः विविक्ताः विद्यन्ते। चतुर्वेदाः, चतुरुपवेदाः, षड्वेदाङ्गानि, षड्वेदोपाङ्गानि इत्येवं मूलविद्या एव सुव्यवस्थिताः विंशतिर्यावत्सन्ति। संस्कृतवाङ्मयं समकालेऽपि लक्षोपलक्ष-सारस्वतकर्मक्षेत्ररूपं विभाति। इत्यं विषयगाम्भीर्ये सत्यपि संस्कृतविद्याभ्यासोऽपि समावेशी जनकीयश्च भवितुमर्हति। समावेशीशिक्षणार्थं पाठ्यक्रमोऽपि समावेशी स्यात्। वेदाद्-लोकोक्तिपर्यन्तं संस्कृतवाङ्मयं सुघटितविज्ञानरूपमस्तीति संस्कृतज्ञानप्रणाली (Sanskrit Knowledge System) इति नाम्ना सम्प्रति अनुसन्धीयते। तदध्ययनार्थं सरलमानकसंस्कृतम् (Simple Standard Sanskrit) इत्यस्य लोकव्यवहारानुगुणस्य उपयोगोऽपि विद्वत्सभासु अनिवार्यतया निर्दिश्यते।

'केरलमातृका'

एतर्सर्वं निमित्तीकृत्य 'संस्कृतसामान्यम्' इति अनुशासनं केरलीयसंस्कृतपठनपाठनपरम्परायामेव विशिष्योपलभ्यते। समानस्य भावः सामान्यम्। सकलासु संस्कृतिवद्यासु समानतया तुल्यतया स्थिता विद्या संस्कृतसामान्यमिति। वस्तुतः केरलसर्वकलाशालायां शतवर्षपूर्वमारब्धमिदम्। अन्यत्रादृश्यत्वात् 'केरलमातृका' इत्यपि कथितुं योग्यम्। इदानीमिदं केरलदेशे सर्वत्र कलालयेषु सर्वकलाशालासु च प्राच्यपठनसङ्कायस्य भाषा-साहित्यसङ्कायस्य वा अन्तर्गतत्वेन बिरुद-बिरुदानन्तर-गवेषणस्तरेषु भूयः पठ्यते। संस्कृतवाङ्मयस्य समग्रप्रातिनिध्येन अनुशासनिमदं स्वयमेव बहुविषयतामावहति। 'सामान्यज्ञानं तु बोधोपयोगी'त्यभिज्ञवचनम्। 'ज्ञेयस्थमेव सामान्यं ज्ञानानामुपकारकम्' इति वाक्यपदीयम्। प्रदीपो यथा स्वप्रभाद्वारा सर्वगृहप्रकाशको वर्तते एवमनुशासनिमदं स्वबुद्धिजननद्वारा सर्वशास्त्रोपकारकं भवति।

संस्कृतसामान्यस्य शैक्षणिकपरम्परा

द्रव्य-गुण-कर्मसु त्रिष्विप मुख्यप्रमेयेषु सामान्य-विशेषौ भेदेन गृह्येते। 'सामान्यविशेषसमुदायोऽत्र द्रव्यम्', 'सामान्यविशेषात्मा शब्दादिर्ग्राह्यः' इत्यस्ति पाठ्यसरिणः। तत्र विशेषगणे व्याकरण-ज्योतिष-न्याय-साहित्यादीनि अनुशासनानि। संस्कृतज्ञानप्रणालीगतानां समस्तविद्यानां सामान्य-विशेषिववेकज्ञानार्थं प्रवृत्तमस्ति संस्कृतसामान्यमित्यनुशासनम्।

अर्थशास्त्रादिप्रदर्शितचतुर्विद्यास्थानेषु 'आन्वीक्षिकी' इत्येकं विद्यास्थानं सर्वसामान्यं दृश्यते। भारतीयशास्त्रेषु चतुर्व्यूहपद्धतिः सामान्या। अनुबन्धचतुष्ट्येन सह उपक्रमाद्युपपत्त्यन्ताः सप्तशास्त्रतात्पर्यहेतवः सामान्याः। सरलमानकसंस्कृतम्, प्रौढमानकसंस्कृतमिति वर्तमानरूपद्वये सरलमानकसंस्कृतं संस्कृतसामान्यस्यैव नामान्तरम्। 'आम्रवनादि'लौकिकन्यायाः जनसामान्यस्य अनुभवकथनरूपाः जीवनमूल्याङ्कनेन सर्वोपकारकाः भवन्ति। तिद्दशैव सूक्तयः सुभाषितानि च। इतिहास-ऐतिह्य-पुराण-स्मृत्यादयश्च श्रेणीसाहित्यभिन्नाः संस्कृतसामान्यान्तर्गताः दृश्यन्ते। इतिहासपुराणादिभिः वेदानामुपबृंहणं सामान्यमानवगणानां लोकयात्रानिबन्धनायेति प्रसिद्धम्।

संस्कृतसामान्यम् इति पृथक्प्रमेयं शास्त्रम्

मीमांसानयेन अस्य शास्त्रस्य 'तन्न'मिति पूर्वव्यवहारो दृश्यते। 'द्विधा हि तन्नं भवित प्रत्येकं वा समुदाये वा' इति कुमारिलः। 'तन्नग्रहणेन च सर्वतन्नप्रतितन्नयोरुपादानम्' इति वाचस्पितः। अन्यत्रापि दृश्यन्ते, 'शास्त्रं चेदं तन्नमावापश्चेति द्विधा स्थितम्' (जयमङ्गला) इत्यादिकं शास्त्रस्य द्विधात्वविवरणम्। यत्सकृत्कृतं बहूनुपकरोति तत् तन्नमित्युच्यते। यथा बहूनां मध्ये कृतः प्रदीप इति। यस्तु आवृत्त्या उपकरोति स आवापः। यथा तेषामेव करगताः ग्रन्थाः लेखिन्यो वा। अल्पेन प्रयत्नेन महतां विषयाणां ग्रहणे उत्सर्गापवादौ व्याकरणशास्त्रनयौ। तत्र सामान्येन उत्सर्गः कर्तव्यः, विशेषेण अपवादश्चेति विवेकः। सामान्योक्तं विशेषोक्तं च तन्नं भवित। अधुनाऽपि सामान्यम् (General), विशेषः (Special) इति शीर्षकद्वये सर्वा संस्कृतविद्याः व्यवहियन्ते।

वैदिकग्रन्थानां याथार्थ्यग्रहणाय वाक्यार्थयोजनायाः सामान्यनियमाः भवन्ति मीमांसान्यायाः। वैज्ञानिकग्रन्थेषु वाक्ययोजनायाः सामान्यनियमरूपाः भवन्ति शताविधकाः तन्त्र-उपतन्त्रयुक्तयश्च। यथा सुश्रुतो वदित— 'सामान्यदर्शनेनासां व्यवस्था सम्प्रदर्शिता। विशेषस्तु यथायोगमुपधार्यो विपश्चिता॥' इति। तन्त्रयुक्तिविरहा वैद्यवृत्तिः निष्फलेति आयुर्वेदपरम्परा। 'अधीयानोऽपि शास्त्राणि तन्त्रयुक्त्या विना भिषक्। नािधगच्छिति शास्त्रार्थान् अर्थान् भाग्यक्षये यथा॥' इति। वाचिनकािन ज्ञापकन्यायसिद्धानीत्यादीिन विभिन्नसूत्रवार्तिकभाष्यटीकागतािन परिभाषारूपाणि च बहूिन सामान्यािन।

अथवा 'साधारणं भवेत्तन्त्रम्'। सामान्यमेव साधारणम्। सामान्यं विभजते परमपरिमिति। परम् अधिकदेशवृत्ति। अपरं न्यूनदेशवृत्ति। न्यूनदेशवृत्ति यथा—अधिकरणेषु विभक्तेषु अर्थ-कामादि शास्त्रग्रन्थेषु 'साधारणाधिकरणम्' भविति शास्त्रमुखम्। स्वशास्त्रस्य सामान्यनियमख्यापनार्थं शास्त्रसङ्गहकथनार्थं वा प्रवर्तते तत्। अधिकदेशवृत्ति तु—शास्त्रान्तरेष्वपि साधारणतया सर्वतन्त्रसिद्धान्तोऽस्ति, शास्त्रानुमोदितेषु न्यायसिद्धान्तेषु चतुर्षु यत् प्रथमं वर्तते।

एवं सर्वतन्त्रसिद्धान्तमुखेन जीविततत्त्वानां सिंहावलोकनं भवित संस्कृतसामान्यम्। संस्कृतविशेषविषयाणां सम्यगवलोकनाय पारस्पर्यप्रदर्शनाय च अनेन अनुशासनेन प्रदर्शितानां तत्त्वानां नितरां आवश्यकताऽस्ति। अत एव 'सामान्यचोदनाः तु विशेषेषु अवितष्टन्ते' इति वार्तिकादिवचनम्।

इत्थम् अस्य अनुशासनस्य अन्यानुशासनवत् पृथक्प्रमेयाः सन्ति । अत एव नूतनप्रणाल्यामिदमेकं प्रमुखम् अनुशासनम् (Major Discipline) वर्तते ।

संस्कृतसामान्यस्य प्राचीनता प्राधान्यं च।

जनपदभाषारूपेण संस्कृतं यदा प्रवर्तते स्म, तदा विद्यायाः सामान्यरूपं प्रकटं विद्यते स्म। सर्वेषां विशिष्टविषयाणां प्राग् अविभिक्तदशा आसीत्। यथा न्यायशास्त्रस्य प्रमेयप्रधानपरम्परा-प्रमाणप्रधानपरम्परा, प्राचीनन्यायः-नव्यन्यायः इत्यादीनां विभक्तदशायामेवान्तर्भावः। यतो हि सर्वेषां मूलरूपेण न्यायसूत्रभाष्ये विद्यमाने। पूर्व-मध्य-उत्तरमीमांसानां मीमांसेति विंशतिलक्षणीति अविभक्तदशा आसीत्। उभयोश्च न्यायमीमांसयोः पुनः 'मीमांसान्यायविस्तरः' इत्येकरूपं विद्यास्थानं चासीत्। एवं सर्वासां विद्यानामेकत्वं भर्तृहरिणोक्तम्—'सत्या विशुद्धिस्तत्रोक्ता विद्यैवेकपदागमा' इति। 'सर्वविद्याप्रतिष्ठा ब्रह्मविद्या' इति मुण्डकोपनिषत्। या विद्या पूर्वं सामान्यभूता सा पश्चाद् भागशः प्रविभज्यते।

यदा संस्कृतभाषा लोकभाषारूपेण प्रयुक्ता आसीत् तदा विशेषविषयाणां विशिष्टविच्छेदं विना शिक्षायाः सामान्यरूपं मूर्तरूपं ददाति स्म। यथा न्यायो मीमांसा च अविभक्तदशायां 'मीमांसान्यायविस्तरः' इत्येकरूपं विद्यास्थानमासीत्। 'सत्या विशुद्धिस्तत्रोक्ता विद्यैवेकपदागमा' इत्युक्त्वा भर्तृहरिः सर्विवज्ञानानाम् एकतायाः उपिर बलं दक्तवान्। मुण्डकोपनिषदि 'सर्वविद्याप्रतिष्ठा ब्रह्मविद्या' इति वचनेन वेदविद्या सर्वज्ञानस्य आधारत्वेन उपवर्णिता। कालान्तरे सामान्यज्ञानं विशेषशाखासु विभक्तं जातम्, यस्य परिणामेन विशिष्टविषयाणि अभवन्। विशेषावगमो हि

विभागफलम्। 'सामान्याभिधाने हि विशेषानभिधानम्। सामान्ये हि अभिधीयमाने विशेषः अनभिहितो भवति। तत्र अवश्यं विशेषार्थिना विशेष अनुप्रयोक्तव्यः।' इति वार्तिक-भाष्यवचनम्।

वर्टिका भाष्यश्च सामान्योक्ते विशिष्टस्य अभिप्रेतम्, विशिष्टतायाः कृते तस्य प्रयोगः आवश्यकः इति अवलोकितवन्तौ ।

अन्तरङ्गं बलीय इति शास्त्रनयः। पूर्विवद्यात्वेन मूलरूपत्वेन वा अन्तरङ्गं सामान्यम्। अवयवित्वेनापि अन्तरङ्गं सामान्यम्। तस्मात्, संस्कृतवाङ्गमयस्य विविधतायामपि तस्य साङ्गोपाङ्गयुक्तम् अङ्गिरूपं (अवयवाः यथा अवयविनि इतिवत्) द्रष्टुं संस्कृतसामान्यमित्यनुशासनस्य पृथगनुशीलमेव सरलोपायः।

चतुर्वर्षबिरुदसरणिषु तन्त्रांशानामुपवर्णनम्

वाक्यं द्विविधं, वैदिकं लौिककं च। वाङ्मयस्य समग्रस्य कृते 'रक्षोहागमलघ्वसन्देहाः' इति पञ्चप्रयोजनं व्याकरणशास्त्रं वेदाङ्गभूतमिप वैदिक-लौिककसकलशास्त्रोपकारकं भवित सामान्यसंस्कृतानुशासनस्य प्रथमोपविषयः। 'सामान्योक्तं विशेषोक्तं च ज्ञात्वा कर्तुं कुशलो' भवतीत्यत्र व्याकरण-साहित्ययोरुपविषयत्वेन समावेशः कृतः। विद्याङ्गेषु प्रधानतया व्याकरणं, विद्याप्रयोगेषु विशेषतया छन्दोबद्धं साहित्यं चात्र प्रथमसरण्यां स्वीकृते। तदनु उच्चारणशिक्षा, मन्त्रश्लोकपारायणविद्या, सङ्गीतविद्या, योगविद्या, भाषाविज्ञानीयं, संगणकविद्या, वास्तुविद्या, आयुर्वेदाः, तर्कविद्या, प्रभाषणकला, वार्त्तवाचनकला, सौन्दर्यशास्त्रं, नाट्यशास्त्रम्, राजनीतिः इत्यादिकमस्यानुशासनस्य विशिष्टाङ्गानि भवन्ति।

अग्रे तु कल्प-निरुक्त-ज्योतिषाणां वेदाङ्गानां तथा योग-वैशेषिकाद्युपाङ्गानाञ्च सरणिनिबद्धाः विषयवर्गाः नैकाः प्रस्तोष्यन्ते।

संस्कृतसामान्यस्य उपयुक्तता

'गुरुक्कल्', 'एषुत्तच्छन्', 'पणिक्कर्', 'आशान्' इत्यादि ग्रामीणाध्यापकद्वारा संस्कृताध्ययनस्य सार्वजनीना काचित् प्रणाली केरलदेशे बहुत्र विद्यते स्म। जाति-वर्ग-मतादिविभेदान् विहाय संस्कृतसरणीं यथेच्छमनुवर्तमानाः केरलीयसाहित्यकाराः तत्र प्रमाणम्। तद्वदाधुनिककालेऽपि केरलदेशे तस्य आवश्यकता सञ्जाता। संस्कृतज्ञानस्य बहुजनोपयुक्ततां हृदि विधायैव अस्माकं पूर्विकाध्यपकाध्येतृभिः संस्कृतसामान्यमिति नूतनमनुशासनं प्रोद्घाटितम्। संस्कृतवाङ्मयस्य जानपदकालभावेनास्य सम्बन्धः पूर्वोक्तः। संस्कृतज्ञानक्षेत्रे अस्योपयुक्तता च पूर्वोक्ता। तदन्यत्र वैश्विकस्तरे बहुविषयकानुवादसन्दर्भेषु, संगणकभाषाविनिर्माणप्रसङ्गेषु, देशीयस्तरे च राष्ट्रनिर्माणस्थानेषु, बहुजनसामान्योपदेशस्थलेषु, आयुर्वेद-वास्तु-संगणकविद्याविधासु, हस्तलेखवाचनप्रवृत्तिषु सर्वत्र लाभदायिकेयं 'केरलमातृका'—नूतनशिक्षारीत्यनुसारेण चतुर्वर्षपाठ्यक्रमोपयोगिनी लोकक्षेमाय जनहिताय समर्प्यते॥
