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ABOUT THE DISCIPLINE

Music is an expressive art form that is multimodal and cross-culturally literate. A thriving culture is enhanced by music, which is essential to human life. It has the capacity to enlighten, enlarge, expand, and improve the human experience. Music can be used to enhance one's cognitive, physical, emotive, intuitive, and spiritual modalities of knowing. Ideas, emotions, and meaning are embodied and expressed via music. It can converse both within and between historical, cultural, socioeconomic, and even prehistoric contexts.

One of the two primary subgenres of Indian classical music is carnatic music. It is an intricate and refined tradition with a lengthy history that dates back to antiquity. Its foundation is a system of Ragas and Talas that emphasises embellishment and improvisation. Carnatic music is distinguished by a complex melodic structure with faint oscillations and shakes, and is renowned for its technical mastery and artistic refinement. Carnatic music also places a strong emphasis on improvisation (Manodharmam) and originality, giving musicians a creative orifice.

University of Kerala's Bachelor of Arts (BA Hon.) in Music degree offers a deep and extensive grounding in the theoretical and practical components of Indian classical music, mainly Carnatic music. Various courses are also offered from the allied disciplines for nurturing interdisciplinary perspectives. Students who are enthusiastic about music and want to advance their musical knowledge, abilities, and creativity should enrol in this programme. This covers several themes, including the theory and practice of Carnatic music, and will equip the participants for success in a range of musical professions. Graduates of the programme will possess a profound comprehension of one of the most exquisite and ancient musical traditions worldwide. Additionally, they will acquire great musical abilities that will enable them to pursue careers in performance, music education, music production, and digital media and so on. Students who learn music can also improve their self-confidence, discipline, and inventiveness.

Admission

Minimum qualification for admission to Bachelor of Arts in Music (Vocal) shall be as per the rules & regulations of University of Kerala. Admission shall be regulated based on an Aptitude Test in music conducted by the Department of concerned Colleges.

Practical

As the subject 'Music' is a Performing art, the term 'Practical 'in Music means preparatory classes for Performance. 'Manodharma' (Creative Music) is the foremost activity of these classes. Hence the practical papers are purely based on singing/performing sessions, and are deemed necessary for the foundation also. However, it is not reckoned as the Lab associated practical of the subjects from the Science stream.

Hence, for a practical course in music, the classroom transaction can be considered as,

1 practical hour = 1 lecture hour.

In theory courses, where practicum component is incorporated, that may be considered as,

2 practical hour = 1 lecture hour.

Assessment and Evaluation

The assessment shall be a combination of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and an End Semester Evaluation (ESE). 30% Weightage shall be given for CCA. The remaining 70% weight shall be for the ESE. CCA will have two sub components; Formative Assessment (FA) and Summative Assessment (SA).
